THE CITY OF PHILADELPHIA

Philadelphia was the newest of all the cities mentioned in the book of Revelation. It was founded by Attalus II Philadelphus, who intended the city to be a center for the spread of Greek language and culture. The city's name commemorates the loyalty that he had to his brother.

The city was located at the intersection of several trade routes that earned her the title "Gateway to the East." The city had a mission to spread the Greek language and culture to the regions east of their setting. Given her strategic location, she became a fortress city experiencing much prosperity because of their industrial and agricultural base, well supported by the fertile plains to the north.

The major drawback was that the region was subject to earthquakes, one of which came in AD 17 and leveled 12 cities in Asia in one night. The city was rebuilt with considerable help from Rome.

Famous for its many temples and religious festivals, Philadelphia became known as "little Athens." Nothing is really known about the founding of the church there.

This church was under considerable persecution from the Jewish population that Jesus identified as a synagogue of Satan. The Philadelphian believers were faithful to the Lord, they didn't deny his name by falling away from the faith, and they endured the hostility with patience. This church was very small and without much influence in their city, but Jesus opened a door of opportunity for them.
