THE JESUS FILES – PART V "Sardis – The Dead Church" Revelation 3:1-6

We've all heard the expression "that church is dead!" Often this terminology is applied to churches that have no new converts joining them, the church is aging, the people are living in the past reflecting on their fond memories of their once thriving church. Jesus says the church at Sardis is like a hospitalized patient on life support. This morning's teaching will explain what treatment can bring a very sick church back to life.

The City of Sardis

In the 6th century BC Sardis was one of the most powerful cities in the ancient world. By the Roman period, it had declined to the point of being known as a relic of the period of barbaric warfare and lived on its past reputation rather than its present status.

One of the unique features of Sardis was that she was built on a mountain 1,500 feet above sea level. Her rock walls rose nearly perpendicular, which made her virtually inaccessible to invading armies, for she was a natural citadel. However, twice in her history when under attack, the watchmen weren't vigilant and their enemies scaled the steep mountain, opened the gates and Sardis was captured. This happened in 546 B.C. when the Persian Cyrus laid siege to her, and again by Antiochus III in 214 B.C. After these two defeats the city continued to prosper economically, but never regained her power and had lived on the reputation of what she once was.

Sardis was finally incorporated into the Roman Empire in 133 BC. Excavations revealed a large Roman theater and stadium. In AD 17 the city suffered a catastrophic earthquake and was rebuilt with the help of the emperor Tiberius. The city was decorated with a variety of temples one of which was dedicated to Cybele (Artemis to the Greeks) who was thought to have the special power of restoring the dead to life. Situated at the western end of a well-traveled highway from Susa through Asia Minor, Sardis was a city of wealth and fame. Jewelry was found in the local cemeteries, indicating great prosperity. Archaeologists first discovered gold and silver coins at Sardis, and it was thought that the art of dying wool originated there.

There is no evidence that the church was under attack by false teachers or that there was any persecution from the Jews or Roman authorities. It appears that Jews and Christians merged into Roman culture, thus making the Christians there a form of Christo-pagans. One would think that under these peaceful conditions the church could thrive; however, the church declined just as the city declined. What caused this spiritual disaster that brought them to the point of almost dying as a church?
