- #1. Why is the resurrection the heart of Christianity?
- #2. Read 1 Corinthians 15:14-10 and answer the following questions:
  - A. In v. 14 Paul says if Christ hasn't been raised, preaching the gospel is useless and so is our faith. Why?
  - B. If Christ hasn't been raised what does that make Paul? (v. 15)
  - C. In v. 17 Paul says if Christ hasn't been raised your faith is futile. What does this mean?
  - D. In v. 17b Paul says if Christ hasn't been raised we are still in our sins. What does that mean?
  - E. In v. 18 Paul says if Christ hasn't been raised those who have died are lost. What does that mean?
  - F. In v. 19 Paul says without the hope of resurrection we are to be pitied more than all men. Why?
- #3. Each of the disciples mentioned in John chapter 20, came to faith in the risen Jesus in different ways (see below). What conclusions can you make about the amount of evidence required for each to come to faith in the risen Jesus.
  - A. John saw and believed, v. 8
  - B. Mary recognized Jesus voice and believed, v. 16
  - C. The disciples saw his hands and side then believed, vv. 19-20
  - D. Thomas had to touch Jesus and believed, vv. 25 & 27
- #5. After Jesus rose from the dead a transition period began. Discuss how it must have been for the disciples to go from having Jesus with them in the flesh, to ascending to heaven (John 16:7).
- #6. Why is the resurrection the basis of our hope? (1 Peter 1:3-5)

# "I Have Seen the Lord!" John 20:1-18

Mary Magdalene's world was shattered when Jesus died! She is filled with sorrow and grief when she discovers that the stone blocking the tomb has been moved, and the body of Jesus isn't there. The only logical conclusion that she could draw was that grave robbers stole the body. The thought of resurrection was absent from her mind. When she discovered that Jesus rose from the dead, her grief turned into joy as she entered into a new relationship with her Lord.
