LIFE DURING LOCKDOWN #3 "The Gospel Can't Be Chained" Philippians 1:12-26

Paul is reporting back to the Philippians about the progress of his ministry. They have supported Paul financially, so he is updating them on his ministry, while thanking them for their generous support. Even though Paul was in chains as a prisoner of the Roman government, the gospel was free as a bird. Significant progress was being made, the gospel was being preached and people were getting saved. The gospel is unstoppable! Even facing the possibility of execution Paul remained encouraged because of the strength he found in the gospel.

- A. Paul is reporting to his supporters--the Philippians, v. 12
- B. Paul's ministry is still bearing fruit, v. 12

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE PHILIPPIANS 1:12-26

Now I want you to know, brothers, that what has happened to me has really served to advance the gospel. ¹³As a result, it has become clear throughout the whole palace guard and to everyone else that I am in chains for Christ. ¹⁴Because of my chains, most of the brothers in the Lord have been encouraged to speak the word of God more courageously and fearlessly. ¹⁵It is true that some preach Christ out of envy and rivalry, but others out of goodwill. ¹⁶The latter do so in love, knowing that I am put here for the defense of the gospel. ¹⁷The former preach Christ out of selfish ambition, not sincerely, supposing that they can stir up trouble for

me while I am in chains. ¹⁸But what does it matter? The important thing is that in every way, whether from false motives or true, Christ is preached. And because of this I rejoice.

Yes, and I will continue to rejoice, ¹⁹for I know that through your prayers and the help given by the Spirit of Jesus Christ, what has happened to me will turn out for my deliverance. ²⁰I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient courage so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death.

²¹For to me, to live is Christ and to die is gain. ²²If I am to go on living in the body, this will mean fruitful labor for me. Yet what shall I choose? I do not know! ²³I am torn between the two: I desire to depart and be with Christ, which is better by far; ²⁴but it is more necessary for you that I remain in the body. ²⁵Convinced of this, I know that I will remain, and I will continue with all of you for your progress and joy in the faith, ²⁶so that through my being with you again your joy in Christ Jesus will overflow on account of me.

#1. What are your thoughts about the Philippians continuing their financial support of Paul even while in prison? Would most churches do this today?

#2. Discuss the opportunities Paul had to share the gospel while in Rome?

#3. In what way(s) did those who were preaching Christ with improper motives try to make trouble for Paul? (1:17)

#4. What are your observations about Paul being able to keep a positive outlook even in the face of other Christians giving him a hard time? (1:17-18)

#5. Think of some examples of preachers today that proclaim the gospel with improper motives.

#6. What effect did Paul's imprisonment have on the believers in Rome, and why? (1:14)

#7. What was the basis of Paul hope for deliverance from prison? (1:19)

#8. Paul didn't know whether he would be released or executed. What was his concern about how he would present himself when he had his day in court? (1:20)

#9. Why does Paul say it is better to die and be with Christ? (1:23)

#10. Why does Paul say it is necessary for him to continue living in the body? (1:24-26)

#11. What is your big takeaway from this teaching?
