The Triumphal Rejection! Luke 19:37-48

At the conclusion of Jesus' three-year ministry he rode into Jerusalem accompanied by the sound of accolades and praise as people welcomed their King! However, the fan fair was short lived! Several days later he was tortured and crucified as he offered himself for the sins of the world. The very people who hailed him as their King, were the ones who cried out "Crucify Him" several days later. In today's message, we unpack the drama of the Messiah's ride into Jerusalem.

#1. THE DISCIPLES ACCEPT JESUS AS THEIR MESSIAH, vv. 37-38

- A. The evidence of his miracles, v. 37

TODAY'S SCRIPTURE

Luke 19:37-48 When he came near the place where the road goes down the Mount of Olives, the whole crowd of disciples began joyfully to praise God in loud voices for all the miracles they had seen: ³⁸"Blessed is the king who comes in the name of the Lord!" "Peace in heaven and glory in the highest!" ³⁹Some of the Pharisees in the crowd said to Jesus, "Teacher, rebuke your disciples!" 40"I tell you," he replied, "if they keep quiet, the stones will cry out." ⁴¹As he approached Jerusalem and saw the city, he wept over it ⁴²and said, "If you, even you, had only known on this day what would bring you peace--but now it is hidden from your eyes. ⁴³The days will come upon you when your enemies will build an embankment against you and encircle you and hem you in on every side. 44They will dash you to the ground, you and the children within your walls. They will not leave one stone on another, because you did not recognize the time of God's coming to you." 45When Jesus entered the temple courts, he began to drive out those who were selling. 46 "It is written," he said to them, "'My house will be a house of prayer'; but you have made it 'a den of robbers." 47 Every day he was teaching at the temple. But the chief priests, the teachers of the law and the leaders among the people were trying to kill him. ⁴⁸Yet they could not find any way to do it, because all the people hung on his words.

Luke 13:34-35 "O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, you who kill the prophets and stone those sent to you, how often I have longed to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, but you were not willing! ³⁵Look, your house is left to you desolate. I tell you, you will not see me again until you say, 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.'"

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

#1. What is the danger in focusing on Jesus' miracles rather than focusing on the person of Jesus?

- #2. Do miracles, signs and wonders always conjure up true saving faith? Explain
- #3. What is the significance of the crowd quoting Psalm 118:26 and Isaiah 9:6?
- #4. The crowd of disciples appears to have accepted Jesus as their Messiah. However, was their faith real or was it just an emotional response? (Matthew 27:20-26, Mark 15:11)
- #5. Read John 6:60-67 and discuss why the crowds were following Jesus?
- #6. Read vv. 39-40 and discuss the exchange between the Pharisees and Jesus.
- #7. Describe how Jesus felt as he approached Jerusalem? (vv. 41-44, Luke 13:34-35)
- #8. What happened to Jerusalem in A.D. 70?
- #9. Annas and Caiaphas had a lucrative business selling animals in the temple courts. In what way(s) did Jesus threaten them? (vv. 45-48)
- #10. Note the popularity Jesus had with the people, but the religious establishment is plotting to kill him. What do you make of this?
- #11. What is your takeaway from this teaching?
