"Purposeful Priorities of Discipleship" Luke 14:25-35

Jesus laid everything on the table for those who were thinking about becoming one of his disciples! He clearly stated the requirements of discipleship up front, so people could think it over and make an intelligent decision. Sadly, when we hear the gospel presented by high profile evangelists we rarely, if ever, hear the stringent demands of discipleship that Jesus presented to his would-be followers. This morning we will take a look at what Jesus requires of his disciples.

#1. DISCIPLESHIP REQUIRES PLACING JESUS ABOVE ALL YOUR, vv. 25-26

- A. Jesus addressed "large crowds", v. 25
- B. Hate means love Jesus more, v. 26
- C. Love Jesus more than all your family members, vv. 26 (Mark 10:28-30)
- D. Love Jesus more than your own life, v. 26
- E. Failure to comply disqualifies you from discipleship, v. 26

#2. DISCIPLESHIP REQUIRES CARRYING YOUR _____, v. 27

- A. True disciples carry their cross
- B. Disciple (*mathetes: learner, student, follower*), Luke 9:23
- C. Discipleship is a life-long journey of following Jesus with your cross
- D. Failure to comply disqualifies you from discipleship

 - 1. Contractors figure out the cost before starting the job, v. 28
 - 2. He'll be ridiculed if he can't finish, v. 29
 - 3. He didn't finish because he didn't start right, v. 30
- B. The 2nd illustration: the warrior, vv. 31-32
 - 1. Assess your battle capabilities, v. 31
 - 2. Assess your enemy, v. 31
 - Ask for terms of peace if victory isn't attainable, v.
