# "The Church – A Purposeful Community" Luke 4:1-21

Why am I here? What am I supposed to do? What is our purpose? These are questions that believers in Christ need to reflect on from time-to-time because the Bible is very directive about what we are supposed to do and why we exist. Periodically, every church needs to go back to the basics and review what Jesus told us to do. When doing that we will discover that we are a people of purpose who do not drift aimlessly through life. Today's teaching will shed light on how to live with a deep sense of purpose.

- A. Jesus is the ultimate Spirit-filled man, Luke 3:22, 4:1, 14

- C. Jesus sent the Spirit to inhabit believers, Acts 1:8, John 14:26, Eph 5:18

- C. The prisoners are freed (lit. released)

- A. The blind were healed by Jesus
- B. The blind can refer to spiritual blindness, John 9
- C. The blind can live in the light, Eph 5:8-14

- C. The Lord is moved with compassion, Mat 9:35-36

- B. The year of Jubilee is the release of all debts
- C. The year of Jubilee is now

#4. Reading Isaiah 61:2 informs us that Jesus omitted the phrase "and the day of our God's vengeance" in Luke 4:19. Why the omission?

#5. Why should the proclamation be a central component of any church?

#6. Jesus mentions four different types of people in vv. 18-19. Discuss the characteristics of each one:

- A. The poor
- B. The prisoners
- C. The blind
- D. The oppressed

#7. How do these categories apply to each of us?

#8. In v. 19 Jesus said, "to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor," which is an allusion to the year of Jubilee. In what sense is the year of Jubilee being fulfilled in Jesus ministry?

#9. What did Jesus mean when he said, "Today this Scripture has been fulfilled"? (Luke 4:21)

#10. Read Luke 4:22-30 and discuss what happened

#11. What is your takeaway from this teaching?
