PALM SUNDAY

The Triumphal Tragedy! Luke 19:35-44

At the conclusion of Jesus' three-year ministry, he rode into Jerusalem accompanied by the sound of accolades and praise, as people welcomed their King! However, the fan fair was short lived! Several days later he was tortured and crucified as he offered himself for the sins of the world. The very people who hailed him as their King, were the ones who cried out, "Crucify Him" several days later. In today's message, we unpack the drama of the Messiah's ride into Jerusalem.

#1. THE DISCIPLES _____ JESUS AS THEIR MESSIAH, vv. 35-38

#3. THE PHARISEES _____ JESUS AS THE MESSIAH, vv. 39-40

- A. They were offended by the praises, v. 39
- B. They demanded Jesus silence them, v. 39
- C. The Pharisees saw Jesus as only a Teacher, v. 39
- D. The stones have more spiritual insight than Pharisees, v. 40
- E. It was time to reveal his Messiahship, v. 40, 9:19-21

#4. THE NATIONAL CONSEQUENCES OF REJECTING CHRIST ARE

, vv. 41-44

- A. Jesus wept (sobbed) over Jerusalem, v. 41, Lk 13:34-35
- B. Jerusalem missed their opportunity for peace, v. 42, Acts 13:27
- C. History was about to repeat itself
- D. The meaning was hidden from them, v. 42
- E. Jesus prophesied the events of AD 70, vv. 43-44, 21:20
- F. Jerusalem missed the time of God's visitation, v. 44

- #6. Why did the Pharisees take offense when Jesus' disciples praised him?
- #7. How did the Pharisees view Jesus?
- #8. What did Jesus mean by the stones crying out? (v. 40)
- #9. Describe the emotions Jesus was experiencing and why (vv. 41-44)
- #10. In what ways was history about to repeat itself for the Jewish nation?
- #11. How does this apply to America, or any other nation that rejects God?
- #12. What is your takeaway from this teaching?
