#5. In what circumstances might we have to play the role of a nurturing mother?

#6. In what circumstances might we have to play the role of a mentoring father?

#7. Paul and his team shared not just the gospel but their lives with the Thessalonian believers. Why is this important?

#8. Why is it important to be a giver when caring for people rather than a taker?

#9. Why is it significant that Paul worked as a tent maker rather than asking them for money?

#10. What is your takeaway from this teaching?
